Withdrawal:

A player may withdraw at any point up to the closing of early bird entries, Tuesday 3rd April, subject to a £5 administration fee. Withdrawal subsequent to this date forfeits the full entry fee.



The Delancey UK Schools Chess Challenge is an annual chess competition in its 23rd year. It has age groups from under 7 (younger players are welcome) through to under 18.

Last year over 40,000 challengers took part in the first stage, the schools/ clubs stage all trying to get through to the second stage, the Megafinals.

The top girl(s) and boy(s) in each age group (6,200 pupils) progress to the 46 regional Megafinals which take place from April to June. From here the best players around 1,700 of them, progress to the Northern, Midlands or Southern Gigafinal in July. Finally, 180 of the UK's strongest players progress to the National Terafinal in September.

How to Qualify for The Megafinal Stage:

Anybody aged over 11 (U12, Year 7 and older) do not need to qualify for the Megafinal Stage, they can just enter online. All younger age groups (U7 through to U11) need to qualify by participating in the first stage either in their school club or at one of the Last Chance Saloon events. Anybody scoring 17 points or more or becoming the top girl or boy in their age group qualifies.

Arbiters Decisions:

All decisions of the arbiters are binding and final.

Pairings:

In all sections of both events players will be paired using Swiss-Manager. Pairings will be posted at http://www.chess-results.com/ as well as at the venue.

No discussion will be entered into concerning the pairings.

Nobody gets knocked out and players are expected to play all rounds. If a player needs to leave early, please inform the controllers prior to leaving or upon your arrival if possible.

Scoring:

Last Chance Saloon sections:

3 points for a win, 2 for a draw or 1 for a loss.

9th West Surrey Championships sections:

1 point for a win, $\frac{1}{2}$ for a draw or 0 for a loss.

Time Control:

In all sections of both events, there will be 7 rounds each of 40 minutes. In the Last Chance Saloon, clocks may be used on the higher boards. In all sections of the 9th West Surrey all games in all rounds will be played with the clocks. Where clocks are used, they will be at a rate of all moves in 20 minutes per player.

Grading:

Last Chance Saloon games will not be graded. All games in all sections of the 9th West Surrey will be sent to the ECF for grading.

Quiet Room:

Will be available for parents and players who have finished their games to wait. Entrance is not permitted in the playing hall during round times.
